Message to Parents: I have enjoyed being the Site Coordinator of our club and getting to know the youth and parents. Nikole Mitchell will be our new Site Coordinator, starting in December, and we are excited to have her join the Milford BGC. I will continue to be a part of the club as the new Program Manager. We are learning about relationship building this month in our *Leader In Me* lessons. I wish you all a fun and safe holiday. Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

Theater Club - In this creative and fun-filled club, students will bring the *Leader In Me* habits to life by acting them out for their peers. Through exciting activities like skits, role-playing, and storytelling, members will explore how these habits apply to everyday situations. Whether it's "Being Proactive" in a classroom setting, "Putting First Things First" at home, or "Synergizing" with friends, students will use their imaginations to craft engaging performances that inspire and teach others. The Theater Club is a place for students to build confidence, collaborate, and express themselves.

STEM Club (Energy Club) • The Energy Club teaches youth about energy, sustainability, and renewable resources through fun, hands-on activities. Participants will build projects like windmills to explore how energy is harnessed and transferred. They'll learn about renewable energy sources, like wind and solar, while discovering how energy impacts daily life and the environment.

Olympic Winter Games Club — The Olympic Winter Games Club lets students experience curling, an exciting Olympic sport. They'll prepare the game by setting up stones and testing if they can glide on a tarp. Students will play together, aiming for the target while learning teamwork and strategy, with fun alternatives to keep everyone involved.

Holiday Family Traditions Club — Youth will make paper chains for a Christmas countdown while learning about each other's family traditions. They will also get hands-on by making no-bake cookie bars. This activity not only teaches cooking skills but also reinforces reading and math as they follow recipes and measure ingredients to create delicious treats.

Puppet Show Club — In the Puppet Show Club, youth will bring their handmade puppets to life in a performance centered around the theme of kindness. They'll have the chance to write, direct, and act in their own puppet show, exploring important messages of empathy and kindness through creative storytelling and puppet interactions.

Nature Craft Club - In the Nature Craft Club, youth will get creative by painting a rock and decorating it with pine cones to make a festive Christmas tree. This hands-on project will result in a beautiful winter scene that they can proudly display at home for the holiday season.

Around the World Traditions Club — In the Around the World Traditions Club, youth will explore global holiday customs.
