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## October Club & Activity Details

### Message to Parents:

We are looking forward to a wonderful month of October here at Mt. Mahogany! With the changing season and festive spirit in the air, our afterschool program is excited to dive into new activities, hands-on projects, and fun opportunities for learning and growth. Students will have the chance to explore their creativity, build friendships, and celebrate the season together through a variety of engaging experiences. We can't wait to enjoy this special month with your children and are grateful for the chance to learn, grow, and celebrate alongside them.

**Social Emotional Learning:** Social Emotional Learning curriculum is an evidence based program that is integrated in afterschool activities to build a positive environment throughout the program -- an environment that encourages students to do their best and be their best. We will have two different curriculums throughout the year: Positive Action and SMART Moves. Positive Action teaches real-life concepts that help students feel good about themselves. SMART moves helps students create a positive environment in their classroom through collaboration, student leadership, hands on games and activities and team building. Social Emotional Learning will occur on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:15-4:45 PM (Positive Action) and Fridays (SMART Moves) from 4:15-5:15 PM.

**Thanksgiving Point-Coding Club** - Coding Club is designed to introduce students to basic coding principles. We begin the course by learning about basic algorithms, then we learn about the Video Game Design process as students plan and code their own game in Scratch. We end the course with a student showcase for friends and family to see the projects.

**Thanksgiving Point-Science Club** - Science Club is designed to introduce students to a wide variety of science niches and professions. Each week we focus on a new branch of science and give a brief glance into the field. The goal is for students to find at least one new field that sparks their interest.

**Project Learn** - Project Learn is an opportunity for students to practice academic skills, catch up on homework, or get any extra support with their school day work. This will occur Mondays and Wednesdays from 4:50-5:20 PM.

**Costume Club** - This October, our program will host a special **Costume Club**, where students will have the opportunity to design and create their very own Halloween costumes. Over the course of four weeks, students will work alongside our costume-making expert, Miss Naomi, to bring their creative visions to life. The club will begin with brainstorming sessions, where each student develops their unique costume idea. From there, they will sketch out blueprints and plans before moving into the hands-on building and crafting process. Each week, students will add new details and components to their designs, learning useful skills in creativity, planning, and craftsmanship. By the end of the club, participants will have a one-of-a-kind costume they designed and created themselves, ready to showcase for Halloween. This fun and engaging club combines imagination with hands-on learning, making it a memorable October experience for our students.
